TOM HARMON

Tom Harmon first discovered his thespian leanings in high school with parts in 'She Stoops to Conquer', 'A Christmas Carol' and a farce which only the cast's parents would pay to see. After matriculating at MSU and U of M, he ended a long latency by coming out of the closet as Sydney in 'California Suite'. His other CCT credits are chiefly 'Little Mary Sunshine' and 'The Good Doctor'. Offstage he is an attorney of sorts and an S.W.M.

GEORGIANNA HOLCOMB

Georgianna comes to the Community Theatre for the first time as 'Mother' in Neil Simon's 'Come Blow Your Horn'. Georgianna lives in Coldwater and is co-owner and President of Holcomb Travel, Inc. owners of Red Carpet Travel of Coldwater and with husband Dennis, has been involved with many Tibbits activities over the years. The Holcombs have hosted several Tibbits Summer Stock people and this first venture 'on stage', says Georgianna, is the 'making good' on a long standing threat to come down to Tibbits and audition for a part - any part . . . now, look out Broadway!
